10th Grade Global Studies (Mr. Nobles) Grades:

- A. <u>Test and Folder Checks</u>: Double grade. Tests are announced in advance, and are just that......a test to see if the student understands the material. Folder checks show organization and what students have accomplished. They are a resource tool for future tests and projects.
 - B. Homework and quizzes: are a single grade when collected.
 - 1. Homework though not always collected will always be checked and given a grade.
 - 2. Homework if often times the students first introduction to information. It is important for this reason that assignments be read and work be completed. As an incentive to complete homework, the following points will be awarded:

Homework done (does not have to be 100% correct): +10 points
Homework more than 50% complete: +4 points
Homework less than 50% complete: +1 points
Homework not done: +0 points
