
Candidate Profile

The School District

he total student population for the Pine Valley Central School District for the 2017-18 school year was 507. Two hundred sixty-five UPK-6 students are housed in a single, stand alone elementary building. Two hundred forty-two students attend the Jr./Sr. High School located adjacent to the elementary school.





Pine Valley has a well-educated, skilled and knowledgeable staff. The instructional program is wellarticulated and utilizes up-to-date teaching techniques, including extensive use of technology at all levels. Sixty-four percent of the school

community are economically disadvantaged, while 55 percent of students are eligible for free or reduced lunch.

After a restructuring period, the District is financially stable and offers excellent teacher to student ratios.

The District is deeply committed to the implementation of personalized learning throughout its educational programs. This work has been supported with extensive professional development and investments in 1:1 technology.



The District enjoys strong community support for its programs and extra-curricular activities. It has a popular afterschool program that enjoys robust student participation.

The Board of Education and administration have consistently advocated for shared services and community collaborations. Pine Valley is a component district of the Erie 2-Chautauqua-Cattaraugus BOCES (E2CCB). Pine Valley students attend Career & Technical Education (CTE), Pathways in Technology Early College High School (P-TECH), Special Education and Alternative Education programs at E2CCB.







The Community

ine Valley rests in the rolling hills of the northeast section of Chautauqua County and the northwest section of Cattaraugus County. Encompassing approximately 120 square miles in the towns of Cherry Creek, Leon and South Dayton, the 2010 census lists the population at 4,441.

Boutwell Hill State Forest offers nearly 3,000 acres for hiking, mountain biking and hunting. The Eastside Overland Trail runs through the forest along with other trails for snowmobiling and horseback riding. Canoe landings in Cherry Creek and South Dayton give residents the opportunity to explore the beauty of Pine Valley via Conewango Creek.



Cockaigne Resort draws visitors from across the region. During the summer months, the resort hosts concerts, hiking, camping, summer tubing and other outdoor activities. Skiing and snowboarding are highlights during the winter months. The Cockaigne Pub recently opened inside the resort's new lodge.



Pine Valley supports agriculture and dairy farms as the primary use of the land. Multiple wineries are conveniently located toward the shores of Lake Erie.

There are a variety of organizations available for residents to participate in, from youth sports to business-oriented organizations.

Located within a half-hour drive of Fredonia and Jamestown, and roughly an hour from Buffalo and Erie, Pine Valley is not far from shopping, educational, cultural and sporting events in the metropolitan areas.
