A Message From the Superintendent

Greetings Panther Families!

With summer ending, I hope it was restful and you had the opportunity to make many fun family memories. The start of the 2024 - 2025 school year has been great thus far. It's always exciting getting back into a routine with the students and staff in the buildings and the halls humming with renewed energy.

I'd like to thank the community for the positive start here at Pine Valley. My focus this year is centered on three main areas. The culture within a district is so important. I will continue to build relationships with the board, district and community. This includes increasing the level of communication with our staff and community. By increasing communication and asking for your feedback on new programs and opportunities available for students, we can continue to build a strong foundation for our students. We will establish a district-level committee focused on the mission and vision of the district. It is also critical that we assess and articulate the effectiveness of instructional programming with a focus on growth. Look for survey



opportunities coming from the district this fall. I want to hear your thoughts and ideas and encourage you to participate.

On December 13, 2023, the Pine Valley Central School District voters approved the referendum budget of \$9,100,000 for the 2023 Capital Improvement Project. We've submitted our design plans to SED for approval. The schedule has the majority of construction work starting in 2026. The Bus Garage electric service will be upgraded to accommodate future electric vehicles, miscellaneous heating and exhaust upgrades and replacing the windows. At the Junior High School, interior scope includes installing the new kitchen and relocating the faculty room, sound and lighting upgrades in the auditorium, new ADA seating in the auditorium, a privacy wall in the girls locker room and miscellaneous plumbing upgrades. A new door will be installed at the Press Box and fall protection will be added around the roof hatch. At the Water Treatment Building, new exterior restrooms will be installed. Highlights include the installation of the new Early Learning parking lot, replacing the asphalt access to the playgrounds, site drainage improvements, adding air conditioning to the elementary office suite, replacing the baseball, softball & modified field fencing.

As you may have heard in the media, our district has been selected as the recipient of EPA funding toward the purchase of eight buses. The current state mandate requires that all purchasing of buses will be zero-emission by 2027 and that all school buses be zero-emission by 2035. Part of this work includes collaborating with utilities. NYSEG is a part of the shared utilities piece and we will be pursuing additional funding through them. We are also a part of a second feasibility study. Oftentimes, we hear about unfunded mandates in education. This funding will help us to move closer to meeting the requirements of the mandate and reduce the impact on our community. Know that we will still continue to purchase diesel vehicles until we are no longer able to do so.

I'm very pleased to share that this school year, we were able to help families with elementary students decrease their costs of purchasing school supplies by providing most of the supplies needed. These items were included in our budgeting process for this school year. We plan to continue to assess what school supplies we require for students and continue to be mindful of the cost for families. It is essential to our administrators, our board of education, and myself that we are not burdening our families with the cost of school supplies.

Don't forget to join us on September 17 for our Outside Open House again this year (Rain Date is September 25) There will be tables from all grades, teachers, special areas, and departments. We look forward to welcoming families to join us for this special event.

FAFSA

Attention all Seniors! It is expected that you will be able to file your 2025-2026 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as early as October 1, 2024. This means college applications must be completed and sent in before you begin the financial aid process. Students should be ready to start completing college applications this September. Although many schools will accept later applications, it is very important to apply on time to receive the most financial aid available. Counselors will be meeting with each Senior to discuss their plans.

The Counseling Department at Pine Valley will provide helpful information to the families of students in grades 11 and 12 planning to attend college. The presentation will include information and assistance on completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and searching for scholarships. 2024-2025 Pre-College Testing for PSAT, SAT, ACT, & ASVAB

PSAT at PV:

For Juniors-

October 16 | 8:00 AM

Students will be given information about the exam in September. For the 2024-25 school year, the cost of the exam will be covered by the school. The exam will be given in school and will take approximately 2 hours. Students will be dismissed from morning classes but will attend afternoon classes.

The PSAT is a preparation test for the SAT. It also helps students measure their understanding of critical reading, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills that are important for success in college. Pine Valley strongly encourages all juniors to take the test on October 16th.

There are test prep sites and materials to help assist the students with the format of the test. The Khan Academy offers a free resource online at khanacademy.org/sat.

If you would like help with the registration process for the SAT or ACT, you may request a pass to the Counseling Office during a study hall. We also have study guides available!



SAT School Day for Seniors:

This exam will be given on Thursday, October 24, 2024. Students must register with the Counseling Office prior to this exam. Deadline for registration is Friday, September 13, 2024. The cost of the exam is \$68 and a check must be made payable to Pine Valley Central School. Your child may qualify for a waiver fee. Please complete the free/reduced lunch form, located on the Pine Valley webpage: Departments>Cafeteria Services>Forms for Free and Reduced Lunch>Household Eligibility Form. Both checks and forms can be turned into Mrs. Youngberg in the Counseling Office.

Cost: \$68 fee waivers available for those who qualify. Late fee cost: +\$34

<u>SAT Registration</u>: Registration can <u>only</u> be done online at <u>www.sat.collegeboard.com</u>. Students may request an appointment to meet with their counselor to assist in registering online. However, if they do not qualify for the fee waiver, they will have to finish registration at home with a parent (due to the payment portion).

The fee for this exam must be paid online. Students who are on Pine Valley's free or reduced lunch program may request a fee waiver from the counseling office.

Saturday exams are given at area high schools (not at Pine Valley). Students can choose their test locations during registration. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the actual exam. Pine Valley may offer an in-school exam when possible.

Photo identification is now a requirement for registering and taking the SAT. When you register online, you will be required to upload a photo of yourself. This photo must meet their requirements: photo shows only you, facing the camera, head and shoulders only, nothing obscuring your face (hair, hands, shadows, glare, sunglasses), and photo is focused (not fuzzy or grainy). If you need assistance with this, the counseling office can assist.

Make sure you choose to share your SAT Score with Pine Valley. This is important if you would like your score on your high school transcript.

After you complete the registration process, you will be directed to print your "admission ticket". This is very important and should be stored in a safe place and taken with you to the exam. More directions and expectations for your test date are also outlined on this admission ticket.

ACT:

Cost: \$69 (No Writing section) or \$94 (Includes Writing section). Late fee cost: +\$38. Fee waivers are available.

ACT Registration: Registration is very similar to the SAT. Students must register for the ACT online. Test centers include Dunkirk, Fredonia, Hamburg, JCC, Olean, and Pioneer, to name a few. The fee for the exam must be paid online. Students on Pine Valley's free or reduced lunch program are eligible for a fee waiver but must request one from their counselor. Make

ASVAB Career Exploration Program for Sophomores:

For Sophomores-

November 7 | 8:00 AM

Our goal at Pine Valley is to provide quality career planning resources, such as the ASVAB CEP. When students can connect their present education to their future plans, they select the best-suited classes for themselves, participate in more career exploration activities, and see more relevance for the need to get a good education and take the next steps for a satisfying career. We are excited to continue offering the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP) to our sophomore students on November 7th starting at 8:00 am.

The ASVAB, the world's most widely used aptitude battery, is comprised of eight subtests that yield three Career Exploration Scores (Verbal Skills, Math Skills, and Science/Technical Skills). These three scores, combined with the results of an interest inventory, will assist students when exploring a wide variety of educational and career options. No one "passes" or "fails" the test because the results represent how well they have developed academic and occupational skills in addition to their capacity to learn a particular type of work or potential for general training. There is a misconception that the ASVAB is only for those planning to join the military. However, our focus is to aid in career exploration, and students' scores will not be released to the military. Letters will be mailed home to families as we approach this test date.

This exam is meant to assist students in career exploration by matching their academic skills and strengths to potential careers. Students will be given more information about the exam in November. There is no fee for this exam.

College Exploration Tasks:

We are strongly encouraging juniors and their families to start (or continue) the college exploration process. Many colleges are currently holding or will soon hold Open House events. It is as easy as a google search! Just search for the college you would like to visit, and then choose their Admissions page. It is a great idea for Sophomores and Juniors to start these college searches as soon as possible. You can no longer wait until senior year to start college and career planning. The college application and FAFSA application timelines have been moved up in the last few years, so we want to help you out with our tips!

Junior Year

Fall

- · Start talking with your school counselor!
- Make sure your schedule is challenging and in line with your future goals.
- Attend the WNY College Consortium at PV in **September**. Meet college admissions reps from the WNY area.
- · Take the PSAT in October.
- Attend college open house events to start your college exploration.
- Start developing your high school student activity résumé. We have templates to help guide you!
- · Keep involved in extracurriculars and take on leadership roles.
- · Do your best academically.

Winter

- Meet with your school counselor to plan for senior year and discuss your future.
- Continue researching colleges.
- · Register and take an SAT or ACT.
- · Look into summer programs at college campuses.

Spring

- Attend the National College Fair with us in **March** (if available).
- Narrow down your college choices with more research.
- Think about a summer job or internship
- Start asking teachers for letters or recommendations (which
 you will need for your college applications coming up). Be sure
 to have your résumé ready to give to them (this will help them
 write you an awesome letter).
- Start planning and researching the financial aid process. The FAFSA is a major part of your college application process.
- Register to take an SAT or ACT. You may get a better score the 2nd time.

Summer

- Continue investigating colleges and start looking at their application processes. You should start applying in August!
- Apply to a variety of college choices- "safe" schools, "reach" schools, and "realistic" schools- to keep your options wide open.

Senior Year

Fall

- Meet with your school counselor to ensure your coursework is still in line with your future goals.
- Stay focused on your academics and do your bestsenior year is not for slacking and taking it easy!
- Stay involved in extracurricular activities and take on leadership roles.
- Take another SAT or ACT if you need to improve your scores.
- Finish up college applications. Competitive colleges have fall deadlines!
- Start the FAFSA on October 1. Submit it before the end of the month for the best financial aid opportunities.
- · Order your graduation cap and gown!

Winter

- Continue doing your best academically
- Enjoy your extracurriculars for this last year of high school.
- · Finish up any college applications, if necessary.
- Some colleges will have acceptance deadlines in the Winter so be ready to make decisions regarding your college choice.

Spring

- You are almost there- but don't stop pushing yourself!
- Finish your academic year strong and do your best. Your academic transcript isn't complete yet!
- Make your college choice and attend their accepted student events!
- · Attend graduation!! YAY!

Summer



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POWERSCHOOL PARENT & STUDENT PORTAL

The PowerSchool Parent & Student Portal is an online portal accessible anywhere on the web that parents can log in to and see all their children (those in grades 5-12) in one place: their grades, assignments, scores, attendance, and schedules.

Student accounts are automatically created when students enter 5th grade or upon enrollment. Parents need to create their own separate accounts and can obtain their student access codes from the Elementary Main Office (ext. 3306) or the High School Counseling Office (ext. 4334). Parent accounts only need to set up the account once and are good for as long as they have students in Pine Valley, with the ability to add students at any time.

Parents and students can access the following information through PowerSchool: schedules, class grades, individual assignment scores, absences and tardies, historic grade information, and report cards. This information can be viewed on a web browser or via the app. To get to the website, simply type "powerschool.pval.org/public" into your web browser's address bar. The app can be downloaded to mobile devices by searching for "PowerSchool Mobile" in your app store.
