Your child _______ sustained a head injury during their sports activity today.

Most head injuries do not cause serious problems. However, problems related to a head injury may not always occur right away. If your child develops any of the following problems you should get in touch with your healthcare provider <u>immediately</u>. Be sure to tell them there was a head injury and when it happened.

- Unusual sleepiness or dizziness
- Vomiting
- Convulsions (fits) (seizures)
- Clear fluid or blood draining from ears or nose without other cold symptoms
- Any trouble with vision
- Weakness or numbness of arms or legs or trouble with walking
- Fever and stiff neck
- Change in usual behavior or confusion
- Continued headache

<u>Please have your child see the school nurse, Mrs. Kenney, first thing in the morning</u> <u>upon returning to school.</u>
