# Superintendent's Message



Panthers and Panther Families,

The Pine Valley Central School District Board of Education is pleased to announce the appointment of Mr. James E. Przepasniak as the district's Interim Superintendent, effective August 1, 2023. He will serve while the Board conducts a search for a Superintendent of Schools to replace Bryna Moritz, who was appointed Deputy Superintendent at Erie 2- Chautauqua-Cattaraugus BOCES, effective August 1, 2023.

Mr. Przepasniak is a retired Superintendent of Schools, having served in that capacity at the Lake Shore Central School District for nine years. Prior to that, he served as Lake Shore's Assistant Superintendent of Instruction for five years, as Elementary Principal for one year, and as the Middle/ High School Principal at Cleveland Hill UFSD for nine years. He began his 41-year educational career as a Business and Computer Teacher at Williamsville East High School from 1977 to 1992.

Mr. Przepasniak and his wife, Sue, reside in Orchard Park and have two sons, Ryan and Jason. He looks forward to meeting students, staff, parents, and community members during his interim superintendency at Pine Valley.

# Seniors Attending College in Fall 2024



Attention all Seniors! You can file your 2024-2025 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as early as December 1, 2023. This date is later than the usual October 1 date, as the FAFSA form

is being simplified and updated. This means college applications will need to be completed and sent in before you begin the financial aid process. Students should be ready to start completing college applications this September. Although many schools will accept later applications, to receive the most financial aid available, it is very important to apply on time. Counselors will be meeting with each Senior to discuss their plans.

# Financial Aid Night

The Counseling Department at Pine Valley will provide helpful information to the parents of students in grades 11 and 12 planning to attend college. This night will give you time to apply before the deadline for priority filing. The presentation will include information and assistance on completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).

**PSAT** for Juniors

The PSAT is a preparation test for the SAT. Still, it also helps students measure their understanding of critical reading, mathematical reasoning, and writing skills that are important for success in college. Pine Valley strongly encourages all juniors to take the test on either October 18th or October 19th.

# 2023-2024 Pre-College Testing

#### **ASVAB at PV:**

#### For Sophomores-January 10 | 8:00 AM

This exam is meant to assist students in career exploration by match their academic skills and strengths to potential careers. Students will be given more information about the exam in November. There is no fee for this exam.

#### **PSAT at PV:**

#### For Juniors-October 18 & 19 | 8:00 AM

Students will be given information about the exam in September. For the 2023-24 school year, the cost of the exam will be covered by the school. The exam will be given in school and will take approximately 2 hours. Students will be dismissed from morning classes but will attend afternoon classes.

If you would like help with the registration process for the SAT or ACT, you may request a pass to the Counseling Office during a study hall. We also have study guides available!

#### SAT:

Cost: \$60 fee waivers available for those who qualify. Late Registration late fee is required, +\$35.

<u>SAT Registration</u>: Registration can <u>only</u> be done online at <u>www.sat.collegeboard.com</u>. Students may request an appointment to meet with their counselor to assist in registering online. However, if they do not qualify for the fee waiver, they will have to finish registration at home with a parent (due to the payment portion).

The fee for this exam must be paid online. Students who are on Pine Valley's free or reduced lunch program may request a fee waiver from the counseling office.

Saturday exams are given at area high schools (not at Pine Valley). Students can choose their test locations during registration. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the actual exam. Pine Valley may offer an in-school exam when possible.

Photo identification is now a requirement for registering and taking the SAT. When you register online, you will be required to upload a photo of yourself. This photo must meet their requirements: photo shows only you, facing the camera, head and shoulders only, nothing obscuring your face (hair, hands, shadows, glare, sunglasses), and photo is focused (not fuzzy or grainy). If you need assistance with this, the counseling office can assist.

Make sure you choose to share your SAT Score with Pine Valley. This is important if you would like

your score on your high school transcript.

After you complete the registration process, you will be directed to print your "admission ticket". This is very important and should be stored in a safe place and taken with you to the exam. More directions and expectations for your test date are also outlined on this admission ticket.

#### **ACT:**

Cost: \$68 (No Writing section) or \$93 (Includes Writing section). Fee waivers are available. Late Registration late fee is required, +\$38.

ACT Registration: Registration is very similar to the SAT. Students must register for the ACT online. Test centers include Dunkirk, Fredonia, Hamburg, JCC, Olean, and Pioneer to name a few. The fee for the exam must be paid online. Students on Pine Valley's free or reduced lunch program are eligible for a fee waiver, but must request one from their counselor. Make

# AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM HELPING HOUSEHOLDS CONNECT

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider if the household contributes more than \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

#### WHO IS ELIGIBLE

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- · Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- Participates in the Free and reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision
- · Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program
- Participates in one of these assistance programs:
  - SNAP
  - Medicaid
  - Federal Public Housing Assistance
  - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
  - WIC
  - Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits
  - or Lifeline:
- Participates in one of these assistance programs and lives on Qualifying Tribal lands:
  - Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
  - Tribal TANE
  - Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
  - Tribal Head Start (income based)

## TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

- Step 1: Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
- Step 2: Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.

#### POWERSCHOOL PARENT & STUDENT PORTAL

The PowerSchool Parent & Student Portal is an online portal accessible anywhere on the web that parents can log in to and see all their children (those in grades 5-12) in one place; their grades, assignments, scores, attendance, and schedules.

Student accounts are automatically created when students enter 5th grade or upon enrollment. Parents need to create their own separate accounts and can obtain their student access codes from the Elementary Main Office (ext. 3306) or the High School Counseling Office (ext. 4334). Parent accounts only need to set up the account once and are good for as long as they have students in Pine Valley, with the ability to add students at any time.

Parents and students can access the following information through PowerSchool: schedules, class grades, individual assignment scores, absences and tardies, historic grade information and report cards. This information can be viewed on a web browser or via the app. To get to the website, simply type "powerschool. pval.org/public" into your web browser's address bar. The app can be downloaded to mobile devices by searching for "PowerSchool Mobile" in your app store.

We have a document on our website which will help guide you through creating your account and will explain how to use the site. If you go to our webpage and click on the PowerSchool link under our Shortcuts menu, you will find a link to the portal as well as the helpful documents.
